2024-2025 BOG-Proposed Capital Projects

PROJECT #4- BOG Emergency Fund

- ► <u>WHAT</u>: Re-new the annual transfer of funds into the BOG emergency fund.
- ► <u>WHY</u>: Sometimes a repair needs to be done quickly with no time to get a vote from the membership.
- ► <u>HOW</u>: Vote to move \$7500 from the Capital Fund to the BOG emergency fund.
- ► HOW MUCH: \$7500 (increase related to inflation)

PROJECT #5- Records Digitizing

- ► <u>WHAT</u>: Collect, catalog and digitize our GNBA community records.
- ► <u>WHY</u>: Records are in multiple locations throughout the neighborhood and need to be centralized and easily retrievable electronically.
- ► HOW: Using a phased approach, collect and digitize documents using a scanning service.
- ► <u>HOW MUCH</u>: \$2500 (Phase I)

PROJECT #6- Lakeshore Dr Erosion

- ► <u>WHAT</u>: Create a system along Lakeshore Drive that diverts rain water run-off from entering the lower pond.
- ► <u>WHY</u>: Run-off water contains oils that will pollute the pond and the action of the water causes erosion of the soil.
- ► <u>HOW</u>: Create a berm or similar system
- ► <u>HOW MUCH</u>: Up to \$10,000

PROJECT #7- Pond Fencing

- ► <u>WHAT</u>: Purchase and install fencing along a section of the southwest side of the lower pond.
- ► <u>WHY</u>: Geese are able to get to the bank/bushes to lay eggs, thereby increasing the undesirable geese population.
- ► HOW: Place a fence from the concrete wall around that end of the pond, replacing the broken section and establishing additional sections.
- ► HOW MUCH: \$3000
